PEDIATRIC TRANSPORT, CRITICAL CARE, TRAUMA, BURN AND SPECIALTY CARE RESOURCES

Emergency physicians, pediatricians and other community physicians in local hospitals can successfully manage most ill and injured children. However, some children may benefit from specialized pediatric critical care, trauma, burn or other specialty services that are not generally available in community hospital settings. Early consultation with appropriate pediatric critical care, trauma, burns or other specialists when indicated can improve the outcomes of these children.

In order to facilitate smooth communications and expedite transfer of children to the most appropriate facility, it is recommended that each hospital within the Coastal Valleys Region develop an ***Interfacility Transport Plan*** specific to the pediatric patient. The plan should identify the types and conditions of patients needing transfer, and include policies and procedures that address both the consultation process and actual transfer of critically ill and injured pediatric patients. Arrangements for interfacility transport, including the mode of transport for the patient, should be made in collaboration by the referring physician and the physician who is accepting transfer of the patient. Physicians are encouraged to take into consideration all the factors affecting the transport process such as the clinical condition of the child, weather, availability of air/ground units, and distance and capability of the transporting team.
